MAP Testing

We officially commenced the MAP Spring Testing for the 2025–26 school year starting, May 11th 2026. Developed by NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association) in the United States, the MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) test is a Computerized Adaptive Test. Unlike traditional exams, it dynamically adjusts the difficulty of questions based on a student's responses, allowing for a more accurate assessment of each student's actual academic level. The test is administered three times a year—in September, January, and May—and the results provide valuable data to support teachers in delivering personalized instruction.
